Dear parishioners,

Our Sympathy to the family of Tillie Grossman, the aunt of Leonard and Rene Jenniges. May she, and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace.
 As we continue our Lenten practices, I want to re-highlight a powerful aid to our spiritual lives Sacramental Confession. We are sinners, and the Lord wants our holiness. So He has given us the Sacrament of Reconciliation to find His mercy and grace.
 Whether the celebration is private (called Form I) or Communal with private confession and Absolution (Form II), every sin must be confessed to the best of one's ability (meaning not holding back a sin.) All mortal or grave sins (grave matter, done with knowledge and intent) need to be confessed in number and the type of sin - and yes, there still are mortal sins! As a result, we need to be prepared by a thorough examination of conscience (the Commandments provide a quick examination). While there is such a thing as Form III in which absolution to all in attendance is granted sometimes called general absolution, this is allowed only under the rarest of circumstances (the Church Universal allows it only in the cases the immediate danger of death of a large number of people or having to wait more than a month for confession). Because of this, it is not allowed in our Diocese, and only a Bishop can give permission for this. Some have attempted to circumvent this by having the penitent name only one or two sins and be given either private or general absolution. This clearly violates the purpose of the sacrament by not allowing a full confession of one's sins in addition to general absolution.
 It goes without saying that the Sacrament must be celebrated in person as the 'immediacy' of persons

(meaning there is no media such as internet, telephone, or notations) is demanded by the nature of Sacraments. In fact, the Vatican has declared that internet and telephone confessions are invalid - the penitent still made a confession, but did not receive absolution, and the sins remain. The sins need to be confessed again and absolution granted for the first time.

Whether venial or mortal, all sins harm our relationship with God, and mortal sins break it. When we confess or sins, we rob Satan of his power - we say "I have sinned, but I know that God forgives." We confront our sins head on. In receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we have Christ's assurance of forgiveness through the ministry of a priest or bishop, and we find true freedom and strength. In my priesthood, nothing has awed me or humbled me as much as a penitent who pours out his or her heart to the Lord, laying the entire load of sins at the foot of the cross, and leaving the confessional as free as the day of baptism. In the end, that is what our lives are to be! Please, as St. Paul says, be reconciled to God! In Christ, Fr. Todd
